## FIELD TRIPS & ENRICHMENT

Each year Shaw School plans field trips and enrichment activities. After a year of remote schooling due to the COVID restrictions, families and staff were eager to get back to a more normal year. To start the year off on a positive note, students, staff, and parent chaperones participated in an overnight field trip to Canoe Island where activities gave our little school community a chance to reconnect and bond.

Randy Steele, a robotics educator who has been to Shaw School numerous times in the past, was able to return to work with the older students in programming robots to solve a problem while the younger students programmed their robots to perform a dance.

The students worked with Ruthie Dougherty from the San Juan Preservation Trust planting Garry Oaks on the former Graham property.

The older students visited the San Juan Island Historical Park and English Camp on a day trip to San Juan to augment their study of Washington territorial history.

The Wenatchee Valley Community College Choir, able to tour again after COVID, returned to Shaw where they worked with the students then performed for the community later in the day. The students joined the community performance for a kazoo playing extravaganza!



## A SNAPSHOT OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

After remote and outdoor learning the previous year due to COVID restrictions, we welcomed students back into the classroom for the 2021-22 school year. Students and staff masked and classroom ventilation was enhanced. Higher risk activities, such as singing and eating, were held outdoors in the new shelter.

Due to COVID restrictions and the continued closure of the Shaw Island Community Building, the Winter Program and the Spring Concert were held outdoors in the school courtyard.
