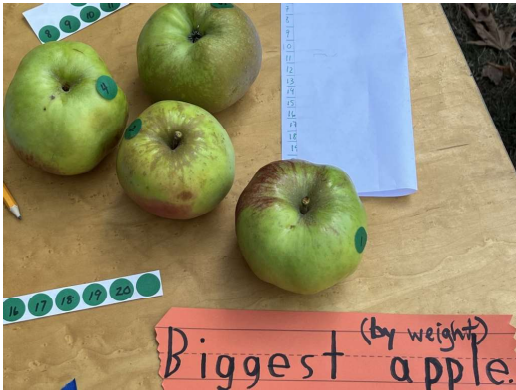

FIELD TRIPS & ENRICHMENT

Each year Shaw School plans field trips and enrichment activities. After a several year break due to COVID, Shaw School was able to rekindle relationships with the other small island schools with joint field trips with Decatur and Waldron to Canoe Island and Apple Day on Waldron.

All Shaw students spent the day on Guemes at the studio of ceramicist Sue Robertson where they made a marine-themed sculpture.

Students took a day trip to San Juan Island and visited the courthouse where they engaged with county staff, including the sheriff and court officials, touring all departments and learning about the workings of county government.

The older students took a multi-day spring field trip to Eastern Washington where they learned about electrical energy production, visited an indigenous museum, and toured Central Washington University.



A SNAPSHOT OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

A special part of Shaw School playground history was revived when current students learned the history behind the corner of the playground referred to as Joe Town. Joe Town is dedicated to its founder, former Shaw School student, Teddy Luttrell, in the 1990s.

Due to the continued closure of the Shaw Island Community Building, the Winter Program and the Spring Concert were held outdoors in the school courtyard.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

As a follow up to planting Garry Oaks on the San Juan Preservation Trust Graham Property the previous year, the younger students once again worked with Ruthie Dougherty to plant native flowering plants around the Garry Oak seedlings.

The younger students worked with community member Ned Griffin learning about ham radio operations and Morse code, and they spent an afternoon in his ham radio shack where they were able to talk with someone in Alaska.
